« Pius VII - The Pope who stood up to Napoleon »

By **Jacques-Olivier Boudon**, historian, President of the Napoleon Institute of Paris 1 Sorbonne, and President of the Scientific Committee of the FECN - Destination Napoleon

While the beginning of Napoleon's reign was marked by a return to religious peace (Concordat of 1801), relations with the Holy See deteriorated rapidly after Napoleon's coronation in 1804. This conflict turned into a religious crisis: many bishops' sees were empty, France annexed the Papal States and took the Pope prisoner.

This conference by Jacques-Olivier Boudon retraces the conflictual relationship between Napoleon and Pope Pius VII, and its importance for Napoleonic history.
